Welcome back!

We would like to extend a very warm welcome back to all of our children, parents and staff, especially those new to The Emmaus Federation. We trust that you have all had a restful summer break and that you are now ready to get back into a school routine that is new for all of us.

As you might expect, this newsletter predominantly covers the expectations around Covid-

First of all, I feel delighted to share with you that all of the children have settled back remarkably well. They are polite, smiley and have taken to Covid measures in school with ease.

Similarly, our new Reception come into school like they have been coming here for years – they have settled so well and are all absolutely marvelous!

We planned as a Federation for the first week or so in school to be 'recovery' based: working on English texts which foster unity, understanding and covers some of the issues pertaining to schools being closed. We feel that the vast majority of children are now ready to take on the whole curriculum and seem to be relishing the challenge of their learning. We will be conducting some simple assessments to ascertain the children's gaps in learning because of Covid so that teaching can be tailored to address any gaps caused by not being able to fully deliver our normal summer term curriculum whilst still ensuring the children are taught the current autumn term curriculum. It will also help us to provide additional support for any pupils who have fallen further behind when we receive the Government's 'catch-up' funding.

As I write this, I have spent the morning updating records for pupils or adults in school who are symptomatic. We have had many reports of symptomatic children: high temperatures (37.8 degrees or above), a new cough or a change in taste or smell. All of the results that have come back so far are negative. I think the high numbers are due to the fact that the children have been apart for so long. However, it does demonstrate how easy germs spread and we are continually reminding everyone about social distancing and making sure everything is clean and everyone follows good hygiene practices. Please can I also ask that you follow this vigilance outside of school as this is not going to go away and it is our priority to keep the school up and running and as safe as it can possibly be.

Please DO NOT send your child to school if your child is symptomatic - it is imperative that we <u>all</u> stick to the rules! The guidance is 10 days for anyone who is symptomatic and 14 days for all other household members. You are advised to book a test and your child can return to school if the result is negative (and all other household members can resume normal duties). The tests are refreshed at 10:00 am and 8:00 pm and this is worth noting as I know this has been a challenge for families.

If your child is unable to attend school and is well enough to do so, you child's class teacher will provide a package of weekly home learning via Class Dojo. All work can be uploaded on the portfolio page so we limit the amount of cross-contamination. If you are unable to access our home learning on Dojo, please telephone the school and leave a message with the office or send a message over Dojo to your child's class teacher.

Finally, thank you for all of your support. I do feel that we need to work as a team on this and we are really grateful for all of your positive feedback and adhering to the measures that are in place.
