Attendance and Punctuality

The start of a new school year is an excellent opportunity to get routines in place at home that support good school attendance and punctuality. Research shows that missing 15 days of primary school in one academic year has a direct, negative impact on pupils. Less than 65% of these pupils achieve good results in English and Maths. However, 90% of pupils with less than 8 days absence achieve good results in English and Maths. It is therefore, very important that your child is in school every day. Being late means missing the start of the lesson, missing the most important information, disturbing the other children and feeling uncomfortable walking into the classroom. It is therefore, important that your child arrives on time.

Holidays

Requests for leave of absence in term time will not be approved unless the headteacher considers there to be exceptional circumstances.

Behaviour Policy

The Emmaus Federation Behaviour Policy is being updated. It maintains our positive approach to managing behaviour and gives greater clarity around unacceptable behaviours and the expectations from everyone. It will be shared on the website and Class Dojo shortly.

Ofsted

Sutterton received an Ofsted inspection towards the end of the summer term. The report should be available to share with Sutterton parents/carers towards the end of the week

Curriculum Updates

Senior leaders and subject leaders have been working hard over the summer on strengthening key areas of the curriculum, namely: mathematics, reading and grammar punctuation and spelling. More time is being given to these subjects which has resulted in every inch of the school timetable being utilised. Class assemblies will now be incorporated into our celebration assemblies and a class will perform a segment about their learning on a given date.

Whole class guided reading: Reading for pupils who have met the phonics screening check from Year 2 - Year 6 will take part in whole class guided reading led by the class teacher three times a week. This is a move away from the carousel system we used previously where a group worked with the teacher on guided reading whilst other groups had support on independent tasks such as comprehension, independent reading or Accelerated Reader. The intent is that a whole-class focus session will ensure all children are challenged and are focused. We will continue with Accelerated Reader and independent reading. Children in Reception, Year 1 and children in other year groups undertaking phonics, will continue with the Little Wandle reading groups three times a week.

Grammar Punctuation and Spelling: This is a real focus for the federation and we have revised our teaching using a new scheme that will be delivered daily for children in Year 1 - Year 6. This will form a discreet lesson alongside the implementation of learning in the children's writing.

White Rose Maths: White Rose Maths is an organisation that provides maths resources and Schemes of Learning (SOL). White Rose Maths frameworks are designed to be enjoyable, engaging and varied, to help pupils develop a love of learning and work towards mastery with differentiated resources. White Rose teaches children mathematical concepts through pictorial, practical and written methods in order to develop a deep understanding, confidence and competence in Maths and improve fluency. It uses the CPA (Concrete, Pictorial, Abstract) approach, which is a highly effective approach to teaching that develops a deep and sustainable understanding of maths in pupils. Our Maths Leaders are working closely with the Maths Hub to ensure the implementation of the SOL is successful and our standards in mathematics remain high.

School Development Plan

Each year we publish a School Development Plan (SDP) which identifies how we can further improve and develop the work of the school, how we will manage change, and how we can make best use of resources and new opportunities available to us. The federation will be working with four teaching hubs on different school improvement areas.

Administering Medication to Pupils in School
