Early Years Framework

On 16th March 2021, the Department for Education (DfE) published a guidance page entitled 'Changes to the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) Framework' on their website. There has been changes to the wording within the Educational Programmes/the Areas of Learning and Development that shape the activities and experiences that children have in early years settings.

The seven Areas of Learning and Development remain the same, with the three Prime Areas being: Communication and Language, Physical Development and Personal, Social and Emotional Development; and the four Specific Areas being: Literacy, Maths, Understanding the World, and Expressive Arts and Design. It is recommended that the new 'Development Matters', non-statutory curriculum guidance for the EYFS (September 2020) be accessed to help us inform our approach to the curriculum, therefore putting the Educational Programmes into practice and supporting the work of our Forest School. There are also 'some minor changes to the safeguarding and welfare section, including a new requirement to promote the good oral health of children'. It is clarified that this change relates to teaching children about healthy eating habits and dental hygiene, and is not a requirement to carry out supervised toothbrushing.

What the changes are (assessment arrangements):

The progress check at age 2 remains the same.

What the changes are (the Early Learning Goals):

It is emphasised here that pre-Reception providers do not need to use the Early Learning Goals (which should not be used as a curriculum). The ELGs should be used as an assessment during the summer term/at the end of the Reception year.

Preparations to implement the new framework into our practice from September 2021 are in place. There are changes to the way practitioners are expected to gather assessment information with the intention that more time is spent with the children making memorable learning experiences rather than spending valuable time collating evidence, which we share on Tapestry. More information about this will be shared with reception parents in due course. However, the new framework is a positive step in that it will reduce workload for EYFS staff so that they can spend more time with the children.
