#### Covid-19 Updates

With the announcement of the National lockdown on Thursday, we understand that some may be worried. We will continue to follow Government guidance and we encourage you to as well. #### **School Lunches**

I am pleased to announce that our hot meal provision is working really well and through careful planning, we are able to offer hot food in a communal environment whilst following Covid-19 health and safety guidelines. If your child is isolating because they are clinically extremely vulnerable or because they have to isolate due to a bubble closure or contact with a positive case, we can offer a food box from the school office which is collected once a week. Please contact the school office if you need to request one.

#### **Birthdays**

We are aware that due to Covid restrictions, many children are missing out on celebrating their birthday with family and friends. Therefore, we would like give the children the opportunity to celebrate their birthday in school with their class friends. On the last Friday afternoon of each month all children who have had a birthday that month will be able to celebrate together. The school will provide games, treats and a birthday bun for each birthday child.



#### **Swineshead Ofsted**

On Tuesday 13<sup>th</sup> October, Swineshead St Mary's was visited by two HMI Inspectors from Ofsted. Owing to the current situation with Covid-19, routine inspections have been suspended, but Ofsted are carrying out monitoring visits to gather feedback on the National picture following Covid-19. Our inspection went very well and the inspectors found that the school is working extremely hard to ensure that we have everything in place.

#### From this visit, inspectors noted that:

- Pupils' attendance is above that usually seen at this time of year.
- Pupils are studying the full range of subjects. You are dedicating more time to the teaching of English
  and mathematics in all year groups. You are planning to increase the amount of time allocated to the
  study of other subjects as the school year progresses.
- Teachers in Years 1 and 2 have checked pupils' phonic knowledge. Pupils who have fallen behind are receiving support to help them to catch up.
- In reading and mathematics, teachers are using the information from assessments to provide more support to pupils who need it.
- Teachers are focusing on promoting pupils' well-being. They have checked what pupils can remember across the wider curriculum. Teachers have used this information to adjust their plans, so that pupils can revisit knowledge that has been forgotten.
- Leaders have developed plans to deliver the curriculum remotely if needed. They have checked that families have the right technology to access online resources at home. You have made sure that remote education is closely matched to your usual curriculum.

I am now able to share the report with you and it will be published on the Ofsted reports website within eight working days.

#### **Pantomime**

Unfortunately, we are not able to go to the pantomime this year, but it will be coming to us! We will be livestreaming Jack and the Beanstalk directly into our classrooms. We also get to take part in an interactive creative workshop with activities based on a 'Blue peter style make' video. Peter Duncan (my generation of Blue Peter) who plays the part of Dame Trott will also be announcing birthdays and special shout-outs.

#### Sir Thomas Middlecott's Exhibition Foundation

I am delighted to announce that Sutterton Fourfields has been successful in a bid to fund resources to start a Forest School in April 2021. We have been awarded £1500 as this make a huge contribution. The grant can only be used for school in any of the parishes of Algarkirk, Fosdyke, Sutterton, Wigtoft, Frampton, Kirton and Wyberton and only for the benefit of the pupils.
